SDEA Announces Six New Committee Members for the New Term 2021 to 2023

42 SDEA Members Elected New Committee Members in the 19th Annual General Meeting to help Advance and Advocate for the Drama and Theatre Education Sector in Singapore

Singapore, 11 Aug 2021 – SDEA announced the appointment of six newly elected Committee Members who will be responsible for leading the organisation for the next two years (2021 to 2023), with the mission to advance the profession of the drama/theatre educator and advocate for the practice and value of drama and theatre in Singapore. The election was done online via Zoom, through its Annual General Meeting (AGM) on 4 Aug 2021 with a total of 42 SDEA members present.

Rosemary McGowan, President



Rosemary McGowan (Rosie in short) comes from an extensive history of using drama and theatre to explore potentially difficult and sensitive themes and issues. She has two Master's Degrees in both Applied Theatre and in Counselling and often combines her knowledge of these two fields throughout her practice.

As a freelance applied theatre practitioner, facilitator and educator, Rosie has taught drama in numerous schools in Singapore, both incurriculum and CCA. She runs workshops and projects exploring themes of self-care, sexual assault trauma, self-harm, communication,

leadership and understanding mental health. She has also designed and run projects in two Singapore halfway houses - the Community Rehabilitation Centre, and The Turning Point.

As a theatre practitioner, Rosie has acted in *The Crucible* (Toy Factory Productions); *Mind Map of Love*, sold-out runs of *The Woman Who Cooked Her Husband* and *Ragnarok* (Skinned Knee Productions); and was dramaturg on Edith Podesta's commissioned production, *Leda and The Rage* (Esplanade - Theatres on the Bay).

She is currently the President of the Singapore Drama Educators Association.

Aishwariyah Shanmuganathan, Vice-President



Aishwariyah Shanmuganathan (also known as Asha Nathan) is an independent Drama Educator and Practitioner. She has been actively involved in community and school based arts projects for more than a decade. In addition to her scope of work, she lectures in tertiary institutions, directs, writes and crafts programmes for teachers and corporates. Through her drama based work, she has also reached learners with special needs, beneficiaries of volunteer welfare organisations, youth at rehabilitative spaces and professionals across various sectors.

As a practitioner, Aishwariyah enjoys drawing parallels between traditional and contemporary art forms/ performance styles and has done collaborative interdisciplinary work in both English and Tamil with various artistes locally and overseas.
